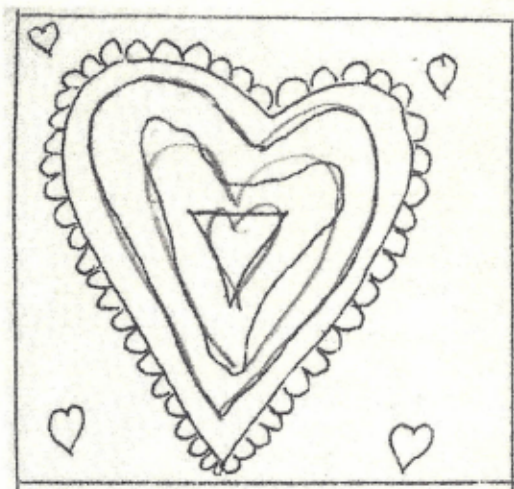


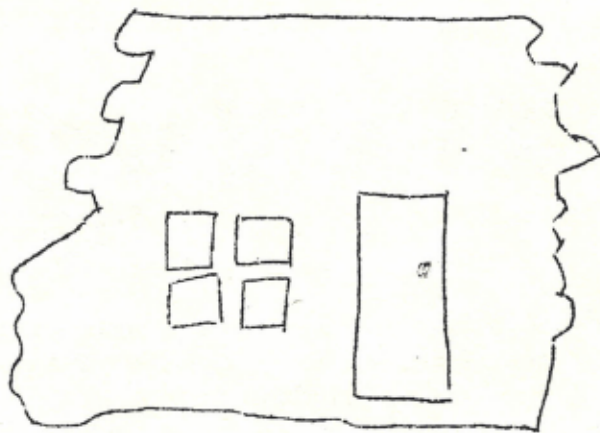
MY VALENTINE – Julia Gjuresko, Gr. IV
